The St. Mary Parish Council met on this date in Regular Session with Chairman Gabriel Beadle presiding and the following members present: Rev. Craig Mathews, Dale Rogers, Glen Hidalgo, Patrick Hebert, James Bennett, Paul P. Naquin, Jr., and Kevin Voisin. Absent were J Ina, Ken Singleton, and Sterling Fryou.

The Invocation was pronounced by Pastor Robert Purvey and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Beadle.

Mr. Voisin moved that the reading of the minutes of the Second Regular Meeting, February 27, 2019, be dispensed with and that the same be approved. Mr. Naquin seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Beadle requested to move up Item 6B, "Dana Judice, Lead Community Advocate, Chez Hope, Inc. to appear before the Council to inform of Chez Hope's 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Trivia Night to be held on April 6, 2019."

Dana Judice, Lead Community Advocate, Chez Hope, Inc. appeared before the Council to inform of Chez Hope's 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Trivia Night to be held on April 6, 2019 at Patterson Civic Center in Patterson, Louisiana.

Rene' Stansbury, LPHI Regional Manager, and West St. Mary High School students, Terrell Joseph and Kelli Moore, appeared before the Council to receive the Proclamation for "Kick Butts Day" that was adopted on February 27, 2019 and also informed of activities that are done at their school to promote awareness of smoking and tobacco use.

Parish President, David Hanagriff informed that he signed an Emergency Declaration on March 7, 2019 as a precaution and reported on the high water at the Atchafalaya River which is currently at a seven point nine (7.9') foot elevation.

Mr. Hanagriff informed that the senior luncheon will be held on March 19, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. in Morgan City and also on March 21, 2019 at the Franklin Recreation Center.

Mr. Hanagriff also informed that the Bayou Horseshoe Pitchers will have their annual recruiting day on March 16, 2019 at 10:00 a.m.

Tim Gilmore, Publicity Director for Bayou Horseshoe Pitchers Association and Louisiana's State Horseshoe Pitchers Association, Bayou Vista, Louisiana, along with Al Dodson appeared before the Council to report on last year events and thanked the Parish and staff of Kemper Williams Park in Patterson, Louisiana for their support. Mr. Gilmore also informed that they will host the State Doubles and the Cajun Coast Classic Horseshoe Tournament this year.

Mr. Gilmore further informed of the annual recruiting day for the Bayou Horseshoe Pitchers and Louisiana's State Horseshoe Pitchers to be held on March 16, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. at Kemper Williams Park in Patterson, Louisiana.

Mr. Al Dodson, Bayou Horseshoe Pitchers Association member, thanked the Parish for constructing six additional courts and expounded on the qualifications and requirements that are required by the insurance.

Mr. Hanagriff expounded on the fencing and light installation at Kemper Williams Park.

Mr. Rogers informed that Franklin Foundation Hospital will host a reception celebrating their 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on March 14, 2019 at 5:30.

Chief Administrative Officer, Henry “Bo” LaGrange, presented his report for a two (2) week period ending March 13, 2019.

Army Corps of Engineers has written on behalf of Major General Kaiser, President of the Mississippi River Commission, that the Commission and staff will make its annual inspection trip along the Mississippi River. **WHEREAS**, on March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2014, the St. Mary Parish Council adopted Ordinance No. 1973 – St. Mary Parish Unified Development Code, and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 5 Procedures, Division 5.4 General Procedures for Public Hearing, Section 5.4.2 Rezoning (Zoning Map Amendments) provides a process for the official zoning district map to be amended, and

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Parish Council of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana:

**SECTION I** - That certain tract of land described in Exhibit "A" is hereby rezoned from the current zoning of Existing Neighborhood (EN1) Zoned District to Agricultural (AG) Zoned District.

This ordinance shall become effective and be in full force upon publication in the official journal of the Parish.

Rev. Mathews expressed his concerns and stated he was very vocal at the January 9, 2019 Council meeting and that it was one of his worse nights in politics, and felt very removed from this political process. There were a lot of emotions on that night and he felt slighted by the fact that the Council voted 8-2 in opposition of what he recommended for the District No. 1 community. Rev. Mathews stated that as a result, the community is still torn and feel that the decision made that night was unfair. Rev. Mathews stated that he can support the ordinance tonight because he is not opposed to revert the name back to its original name, Cypremort Road. However, he feels it was not handled in the proper manner and did not allow the opportunity to bring healing and resolve to people who felt wounded and betrayed. Regardless how the decision would have went that night, there would have been people upset, which is the reason he suggested a decision not be made that night but to give an opportunity to the residents of the community to discuss and find a happy resolve to this issue. It was never intended to offend anyone by the decision to rename Cypremort Road to Joseph Tooney Davis Drive. Rev. Mathews stated that he hopes that future decisions will be made respective of the district that each Councilman represents.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2179**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2160 ADOPTED NOVEMBER 14, 2018  
PROVIDING FOR THE RENAMING OF  
JOSEPH TOONEY DAVIS DRIVE**

**WHEREAS**, by enacting Ordinance 2160 on November 14, 2018 the St. Mary Parish Council renamed Cypremort Road from its intersection with LA Hwy. 318 to its intersection with LA Hwy 83 to “Joseph Tooney Davis Drive”.

**WHEREAS**, by enacting Ordinance No. 2175 on January 9, 2019, the Parish Council renamed a portion of Joseph Tooney Davis Drive back to Cypremort Point Road from its intersection with Big Four Corners Road to its intersection with LA Hwy. 83 back to Cypremort Road.

**WHEREAS**, the St. Mary Parish Council believes it appropriate to amend Ordinance No. 2160 to rename that remaining portion of what is now “Joseph Tooney Davis Drive” from its intersection with Big Four Corners Road to its intersection with LA Hwy. 318 back to Cypremort Road.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the St. Mary Parish Council, acting as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, hereby amend Ordinance 2160 adopted on November 14, 2018 to add Section 1.2 to read as follows:

Section 1.2 “Joseph Tooney Davis Drive” from its intersection with Big Four Corners Road to its intersection with LA Hwy. 318 shall be renamed back to Cypremort Road.

This ordinance shall become effective upon the signature of the President of St. Mary Parish.

This ordinance having been offered and read on this the 12<sup>th</sup> day of February 2019; having been published in accordance with law; and having been heard in a public hearing at Franklin, Louisiana on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 2019; was adopted.

## **ORDINANCE NO. 2180**

### **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 8-2, "PRECINCTS DESIGNATED", OF THE ST. MARY PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES**

**WHEREAS**, LA RS 18:532.1 gives St. Mary Parish the ability to modify voting precincts to be used for redistricting purposes, and;

**WHEREAS**, these consolidated prospective precincts will not affect any elections that take place before the redistricting efforts beginning March 31, 2020, and;

**WHEREAS**, Adjacent Precincts of 04 and a portion 06; a portion of 06 and 07; 08 and 09; 23 and 23A; 24 and 24A; 38 and 40; 41 and 41A can be merged into one precinct respectively, and;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the St. Mary Parish Council, in regular session assembled, that the following precincts are amended in their descriptions and the new consolidated whole precincts are redescribed to comply with La. R.S. 18:532B(4)(b)(ii) which descriptions and polling locations are hereby to wit:

**New Precinct 4            A merging of Old Precinct 4 and a portion of Old Precinct 6  
Polling Location – Baldwin Community Center**

Beginning at the intersection of the St. Mary/Iberia Parish boundary line and the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, northeasterly and easterly along the St. Mary/Iberia Parish boundary line to its intersection with the centerline of the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee; thence, southwesterly and southeasterly along the centerline of the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee to its intersection with the centerline of Martin Ridge Road; thence, southerly, southeasterly, and southwesterly along the centerline of Martin Ridge Road to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 87; thence, southwesterly, westerly, northerly, and northwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 87 to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 324 (Charenton Bridge Approach Road); thence, westerly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 324 (Charenton Bridge Approach Road) to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, northwesterly, westerly, southwesterly, and westerly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with La. Hwy. 670 (Adeline Bridge Approach Road); thence, southwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 670 (Adeline Bridge Approach Road) to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 to its intersection with the centerline of Allain Rd.; thence northerly along the centerline of Allain Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Deslignes Rd.; thence, easterly along the centerline of Deslignes Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.); crossing La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.) to its intersection with the centerline of Charlie Ln.; thence easterly along the centerline of Charlie Ln. and the straight line extension of Charlie Ln. to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with the straight line extension of Ronnie St.; thence, northwesterly along the straight line extension of Ronnie St. and the centerline of Ronnie St. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.); thence, southwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.) to its intersection with the centerline of Sherry St.; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of Sherry St. to its intersection with the centerline of Malcolm St.; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of Malcolm St. to its intersection with the centerline of Joseph St.; thence, westerly and southerly along the centerline of Joseph St. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 83; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 83 to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Choupique; thence, northerly along the centerline of Bayou Choupique to its intersection with the centerline of U.S. Hwy. 90; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of U.S. Hwy. 90 to its intersection with the centerline of Desonnier Rd.; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of Desonnier Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182; thence, northwesterly

along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 to its intersection with the centerline of Sorrel Bridge Approach Rd; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of Sorrel Bridge Approach Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, northwesterly and southwestly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with the St. Mary/Iberia Parish boundary line, the point of beginning.

**New Precinct 7      A merging of Old Precinct 7 and a portion of Old Precinct 6**  
**Polling Location – Raintree Elementary School**

Beginning at the intersection of the centerlines of La. Hwy. 670 (Adeline Bridge Approach Rd.) and Bayou Teche; thence, southeasterly and northeasterly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 324 (Charenton Bridge Approach Rd.); thence, easterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 324 (Charenton Bridge Approach Rd.) to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 87; thence, southeasterly, southerly, and easterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 87 to its intersection with the centerline of Katy Bridge Approach Rd.; thence, southerly along the centerline of Katy Bridge Approach Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, westerly, northwesterly, and northerly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with the straight line extension of Charlie Ln.; thence westerly along the straight line extension of the centerline of Charlie Ln. and the centerline of Charlie Ln. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.); crossing La. Hwy. 326 (Chitimacha Trl.) to its intersection with the centerline of Deslignes Rd.; thence westerly along the centerline of Deslignes Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Allain Rd.; thence, southerly along the centerline of Allain Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 670 (Adeline Bridge Approach Rd.); thence, northeasterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 670 (Adeline Bridge Approach Rd.) to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche, the point of beginning.

**New Precinct 8      A merging of Old Precinct 8 and Old Precinct 9**  
**Polling Location – Sacred Heart Catholic Church Hall**

Beginning at the intersection of the centerlines of Joseph St. and La. Hwy. 182; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 (Main St.) to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 83; thence southwestly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 83 of its intersection with the centerline of the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad main line track; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad main line track to its intersection with the centerline of Haven St.; thence, northerly along the centerline of Haven St. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 (Main St.); thence, northwesterly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 (Main St.) to its intersection with the centerline of Orphans Home St.; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of Orphans Home St. and its straight line extension to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of Bayou Teche to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of Ronnie St.; thence, northwesterly along the straight line extension of the centerline of Ronnie St. and the centerline of Ronnie St. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 326 (Charenton Rd.); thence, southwestly along the centerline of La. **New Precinct 23      A merging of Old Precinct 23 and Old Precinct 23A**

Beginning at the intersection of the centerlines of U.S. Hwy. 90 and the Hanson Canal; thence, southerly and westerly along the centerline of the Hanson Canal to its intersection with the Franklin Canal; thence, southwestly along the centerline of the Franklin Canal to its intersection with the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence, westerly along the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the centerline of the Charenton Drainage & Navigation Canal; thence, southwestly along the centerline of the Charenton Drainage & Navigation Canal to its intersection with the St. Mary/Iberia Parish boundary line; thence, southerly and easterly along the St. Mary Parish boundary line to its intersection with the straight

line extension of the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet; thence, northeasterly along the straight line extension of the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet, the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet, and its straight line extension to the St. Mary/St. Martin Parish boundary line; thence, northwesterly along the St. Mary/St. Martin Parish boundary line to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of Lake Rd.; thence, southwesterly along the straight line extension of the centerline of Lake Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of the Verdunville Canal; thence, southerly along the straight line extension of the centerline of the Verdunville Canal and the centerline of the Verdunville Canal to its intersection with the centerline of the Bayou Teche; thence, westerly along the centerline of the Bayou Teche to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of Rose Rd.; thence, southerly along the straight line extension of the centerline of Rose Rd. and the centerline of Rose Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Prairie Rd. N.; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of Prairie Rd. N. to its intersection with the centerline of Martin Rd.; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of Martin Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of Prairie Rd. Circle; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of Prairie Rd. Circle to its intersection with the centerline of Yellow Bayou Rd.; thence, northerly along the centerline of Yellow Bayou Rd. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 317; thence, southerly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 317 to its intersection with the centerline of U.S. Hwy. 90; thence, westerly along the centerline of U.S. Hwy. 90 to its intersection with the centerline of the Hanson Canal, the point of beginning.

**New Precinct 24      A merging of Old Precinct 24 and Old Precinct 24A**  
**Polling Location – Patterson High School**

Beginning at the intersection of the centerlines of the Wax Lake Outlet and the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad track; thence, easterly along the centerline of the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad track to its intersection with the centerline of the Patterson Canal; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of the Patterson Canal to its intersection with the centerline of an unnamed drainage canal; thence, northerly along the unnamed drainage canal to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of Cremo Ln.; thence, northeasterly along the straight line extension of the centerline of Cremo Ln. and the centerline of Cremo Ln. to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 182; thence, northerly along the centerline of La. Hwy. 182 to its intersection with the centerline of Amanda Ln.; thence, northerly along the centerline of Amanda Ln. and its straight line extension to its intersection with the centerline of Bayou Teche (Lower Atchafalaya River); thence, easterly, southeasterly, southerly, easterly, northeasterly, and southeasterly along the centerline of Bayou Teche (Lower Atchafalaya River) to its intersection with the centerline of the Atchafalaya River; thence, northerly and easterly along the centerline of the Atchafalaya River to the centerline of the Alternate Route of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of the Alternate Route of the Intracoastal Waterway to its intersection with the St. Mary/St. Martin Parish boundary line; thence, northwesterly and westerly along the St. Mary/St. Martin Parish boundary line to its intersection with the straight line extension of the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet; thence, southwesterly along the straight line extension of the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet and the centerline of the Wax Lake Outlet to its intersection with the centerline of the Burlington Northern & Santa Fe Railroad track, the point of beginning.

**New Precinct 38      A merging of Old Precinct 38 and Old Precinct 40**  
**Polling Location – Health Unit/911 Building**

Beginning at the intersection of the centerlines of 6<sup>th</sup> St. and Franklin St.; thence, northeasterly along the centerline of Franklin St. and the straight line extension of the centerline of Franklin St. to its intersection with the centerline of Drainage Canal A; thence, southerly along the centerline of Drainage Canal A to its intersection with the centerline of an unnamed drainage canal north of Brownell Homes in Section 36; thence, northeasterly and easterly along the centerline of the unnamed drainage canal to its intersection with the centerline of La. Hwy. 70 (Marguerite St.); thence, easterly along the centerline of the unnamed drainage canal to its intersection with the centerline of an unnamed drainage canal south of Lake End Park; thence, northeasterly and southeasterly along the centerline of the unnamed drainage canal south of Lake End Park to its intersection with the shoreline of Lake Palourde; thence, southerly along the shoreline of Lake Palourde to its intersection with the centerline of Cook-Collins Canal; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of the Cook-Collins Canal to its intersection with the centerline of an

unnamed drainage canal; thence, northwesterly along the centerline of the unnamed drainage canal to its intersection with the centerline of the westbound lanes of U.S. Highway 90; thence, southwesterly along the centerline of the westbound lanes of U.S. Highway 90 to its intersection with the centerline of La. Highway 182; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of La.
