JUNE 10, 2015
FRANKLIN, LOUISIANA

The St. Mary Parish Council met on this date in Regular Session with Chairman Kevin Voisin presiding and the following members present: Lionel Metz, Charles Middleton, Glen Hidalgo, Ken Singleton, Logan Fromenthal, Dr. Tim Tregle, Sterling Fryou, Steve Bierhorst and Albert Foulcard. Absent was David Hanagriff.

Mr. Metz pronounced the Invocation and Mr. Middleton led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Fryou moved that the reading of the minutes of the Second Regular Meeting, May 27, 2015 be dispensed with and that the same be approved. Mr. Foulcard seconded the motion, which carried.

Mark Bogan, 7413 Hwy. 182 Verdunville appeared before the Council to inquire relative to what entity will handle funding for drivers of the Veterans Transportation Network program.

Mr. Voisin commented relative to the liability of handling funding for drivers of the Veterans Transportation Network program.

Mr. Foulcard informed that he would meet with Mr. LaGrange to determine what can be done to resolve the matter.

Mr. LaGrange stated that he met with Mr. Bogan to discuss the Parish's reluctances to handle the stipends due to the liability toward the Parish.

Mr. LaGrange stated that Mr. Bogan was informed that the Administration will meet with the Parish's Legal Advisor to discuss avenues to handle funding for drivers of the Veterans Transportation Network program.

Mr. LaGrange further stated that Mr. Bogan would be contacted in the near future regarding their findings after meeting with Mr. Duplantis relative to the matter.

Ms. Melissa Cloutet, Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association, appeared before the Parish Council to inform that she is the local Government outreach person for Terrebonne, Lafourche, Assumption and St. Mary Parishes.

Mr. Naquin, Parish President reported on the inspection held on June 9, 2015 on the Point Chevreuil Wayfayer Rings. (Substantial Completion on the project proposes to be completed by week end June 19, 2015.)

Mr. Naquin informed that he, Messrs. LaGrange and Punch did a walk-through of the Blevins Building project. (The project proposed to be completed in approximately one (1) month.)

In regard to the Deer Island Bayou Project, Mr. Naquin stated that bids will be let in the near future.

Henry "Bo" LaGrange, Chief Administrative Officer presented his report for a two (2) week period ending June 10, 2015.

Mr. LaGrange read the following item in his report, "A requirement of the RESTORE ACT for coastal parishes that receive a dedicated allocation in the Gulf Restoration Trust Fund for use in projects and programs related to the restoration of the Gulf Coast Region is to prepare a Multiyear Plan outlining how it proposes to use the dedicated funds on eligible projects. St. Mary Parish has prepared a draft Multiyear Plan and is formerly announcing it to the public. In

addition, a Public Notice will be published in the official journal which advises that St. Mary Parish Government has released for public feedback with a comment period of 45 days, its Draft Multyyear Plan under the RESTORE ACT. St. Mary Parish will currently receive \$304,356 to use on eligible projects. The proposed projects include installation of a fishing pier at Burns Point and installation of a fishing pier at the Jessie Fontenot Memorial Boat Landing in Berwick. The new fishing piers will promote tourism in the Gulf Coast Region by creating recreational fishing opportunities. The objective is to allow those without boats to enjoy the abundant fishing fresh and saltwater fishing opportunities offered in coastal Louisiana. The draft plan proposes to use \$167,396 of the allocation for the Burns Point Fishing Pier with a match of \$59,113 in parish funds for a total project cost of \$226,509. The draft plan proposes to use \$136,960 of the allocation for the Jessie Fontenot Memorial Landing with a match of \$45,160 in parish funds for a total project cost of \$182,120. The Draft Multyyear Plan is available for inspection at the Parish Council Office and is available for download on St. Mary Parish Government's website: www.stmaryparishla.gov. Public comments will be accepted until July 29th, 2015 and may be sent to: St. Mary Parish Government, 500 Main Street, Fifth Floor, Franklin, LA 70538 or via e-mail at admin@stmaryparishla.gov."

Mr. LaGrange stated that the \$304,356 allocated is from the \$1billion in fines that TransOcean paid into the Restore Act as a result of the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

Mr. LaGrange stated that once BP fine is settled, more funds will be made available to St. Mary Parish and the other 19 coastal parishes in the State.

Mr. LaGrange stated that the Parish will receive 1.8% of the funds.

In response to an inquiry by Mr. Metz regarding the grant received for the Glencoe Water System, Angela Kramer, Firmin Architect stated that they are in the process of Environmental clearance at this time. (The process period is approximately six (6) months.)

Ms. Kramer further stated that the Engineers are in the process of working on the plans and acquisition of the property for the new plant.

In regard to the St. Peter Street Community Sewer System project, Mr. LaGrange stated that an expropriation Court hearing will be held in July 2015 in order that the Parish can proceed with the Sewer Project.

In response to an inquiry regarding a written report from the mediator, Gary McGoffin for Franklin Foundation Hospital, Mr. Duplantis, Legal Advisor stated that he has not received any information at this time.

In response to an inquiry by Mr. Voisin, Mr. LaGrange informed that RFPs will be received and opened on June 16, 2015 for the Collection & Disposal of Residential Solid Waste and the Collection & Disposal of Institutional Solid Waste.

Mr. Foulcard moved that the Public Hearing Report – May 27, 2015 be approved. Mr. Fromenthal seconded the motion, which carried.

Mr. Voisin informed the Council that Bo Duhe, District Attorney will be hosting a Tri-Parish Luncheon and Educational seminar at the Cypress Bayou Casino on Tuesday, June 16, 2015 at 10:30 a.m.

RESOLUTION

Resolution approving the holding of an election in Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, on Saturday, October 24, 2015, to authorize the renewal of a special tax therein.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana (the "District"), adopted a resolution on June 8, 2015, calling a special election in the District on Saturday, October 24, 2015, to authorize the renewal of a special tax therein; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the District has requested that this Parish Council, acting as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, give its consent and authority for the District to hold the aforesaid election, and in the event that the election carries to continue to levy and collect the special tax provided for therein; and

WHEREAS, as required by Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, it is now the desire of this Parish Council to approve the holding of said election and in the event that the election carries, to continue to levy and collect the special tax provided for therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Parish Council of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish, that:

SECTION 1. In compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and in accordance with the request of the Board of Commissioners of Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, this Parish Council hereby approves the holding of an election in the District, on Saturday, October 24, 2015, at which election there will be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:

PROPOSITION (TAX RENEWAL)

Shall Consolidated Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana (the "District"), levy a special tax of eight and eleven hundredths (8.11) mills on all the property subject to taxation in the District (an estimated \$1,456,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2017 and ending with the year 2026, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, maintaining and operating gravity drainage works within and for the District?

SECTION 2. In the event the election carries, this Parish Council does hereby further consent to and authorize the District to continue to levy and collect the special tax provided for therein.

For the 12-month period of July 1st, 2015 to June 30th, 2016 the *Banner-Tribune* offers to publish all of the parish’s minutes, public notices, ordinances, etc. at the rate of \$6.00 per square which equals to \$3.00 per column inch. This rate does not extend to fee-paid advertising which is a notice placed by a government entity but billed to a third party. Fee paid advertising rates are set by separate fee-paid advertising legislation.
